#### **Principal's Report**

Current Enrollment: 578 students and climbing (133 Grade 6, 130 Grade 7, 161 Grade 8, 154 Grade 9)

Grade 6: 4 English classes, 2 French Immersion classes

Grade 7: 2 English classes, 1 late French Immersion classes, 2 early French Immersion classes, one combined 7/8

Grade 8: 4 English classes, 1 late French Immersion classes, 2 early French Immersion classes

Grade 9: 4 English classes, two early/late immersion

Enrollment. A lot of new enrollment over the summer and at the start of school. Classes over cap in grade 6. We have been provided another grade 6 English class- to be hired- and teachers are in the process of designing the class & where the class location will be in the school. Job is posted and closes Tues. Sept. 20th. We are also over cap in grade 7 English classes and have shared this information with our supervisor at HRCE. We are waiting for follow up in regards to grades 7 enrollment.

Many new to Canada students enrolled here at Ridgecliff. Students appear to be settling in well here and we are in the process to ensure support and information are shared with these families and students.

- Activity Box accessible for students during recess & lunch— in need of items for play and activity (soccer and basketball, skipping ropes, etc.)
- Groups & athletics- are being planned and are starting up. Staff are volunteering and we
  are encouraging students to get involved. Leadership has an initial start up meeting
  tomorrow at lunch.

**Leave school property**- we may have to revisit this option for students' leaving school property as we have heard of concerns from others in the neighborhood. We will continue to monitor.

Question raised regarding RCMP liaison - does this still exist. RCMP have changed their approach and there are no liaison's attached to school with RCMP. We have been told we call the non-emergency line and officers will respond.

**School Success Plan**- Our goal will be to discuss what are the targeted strategies & approaches needed here at RMS. Conversations will take place for all staff, during PLC and staff meetings, as we dig deeper into data in an effort to support student achievement & well being here at RMS. We will be using evidence & data (classroom & provincial)- to respond collectively to school needs and individual student needs.

- Question- were parents happy with the PD at the beginning of September, rather than the end of Sept. like the past? Much better, less disruptive and easier transition and better flow. Teachers enjoyed it but found it a bit overwhelming and not as effective timing for the adaptations as we didn't know our students yet.
- **Finance-** student fees will not be charged to families this year.
- SAC Grants- approx. \$5578 (\$5000/school + \$1.00/student)

- Exterior cameras- we would like to have cameras on the exterior of the school. We have asked HRM counselors to help support this financially. Mr. White reached out to Ms. Stoddard to set up a meeting.
- Question- can we share the homework hub with the parents & students? Admin will post on a website and have teachers share with students on google classroom.
- Question- how can parents know more about the school announcements? We will look into this and see how we can share extra curricular dates, etc. with parents.

#### • STUDENT REPORT-

- Lots of opportunities for clubs, sports, and groups to join. Students are looking to see if the art club? - Ms. Bezanson is planning on starting an art club. And maybe a tech/ hands on club, like makerspace.
- The school is welcoming. Better respect for our school.
- Kindness idea: we want to reward kindness and encourage students by nominating students and providing them with rewards.
- Accessible: someone in a wheelchair needs to be better accessible. (locker, gymnasium door, washroom door, desk with storage ss does not fit there)
